*Organist/Composer Phoebe Knapp was the wife of Joseph Fairchild Knapp, one of the founders of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company. Phoebe composed over 500 songs, the most famous of which being "Assurance," for which her friend (and fellow congregant at John St. Methodist Episcopal Church NYC) Fanny Crosby penned the lyrics — on the spot at once, having heard Phoebe play the tune, so the story goes. After her husband's death, Mrs. Knapp shared the vast majority of her wealth with charitable causes. She died in the summer of 1908 in Poland, Maine where she was a seasonal resident of the Poland Spring Resort.
